






#### **LCD** Display

The RMC-180 status or the setup menu options are displayed on the LCD panel.

#### **Menu Control Dials**

The RMC-180 configuration menu can be entered and changed using these dials.





#### FOCUS

To manually control focus adjustment, first press the AUTO/MANUAL button so it is illuminated or ON.

The FOCUS dial can then be turned to achieve the desired focus.

If the AUTO/MANUAL button is not illuminated or OFF, then the camera will use its own Auto Focus feature if this function is available.





#### IRIS

To manually control Iris adjustment, first press the AUTO/MANUAL button so it is illuminated or ON.

The IRIS dial can then be turned to achieve the desired exposure.

If the AUTO/MANUAL button is not illuminated or OFF, then the camera will use its own Auto Iris feature if this function is available.

#### Channel A, B, C, D buttons

To control or set up a connected camera, first select it using these buttons. The selected camera button will be illuminated or ON.

#### **PTZ Joystick Control**

Before attempting to use the joystick to PAN, TILT or ZOOM a selected camera, first unlock the joystick by pressing the LOCK button.

**PAN** – Move the joystick horizontally to the left or right to pan the selected PTZ camera head from left to right or vice versa.

**TILT** – Move the joystick up or down to tilt the selected camera head up or down.

**ZOOM** – Twist the joystick clockwise (to the right) or anticlockwise (to the left) to have the selected camera zoom in or out.


#### Speed

The speed at which the selected camera moves can be chosen by pressing one of three speed buttons.



#### STR

Pressing this button enters the RMC-180 into STORE MODE. When activated, this allows the current camera position to be stored in a chosen Channel Memory Button.



#### **Channel Memory Buttons**


These buttons may be used to store up to four camera positions for each camera. Each button corresponds to one camera and one stored position. The activated button for each camera is illuminated.

#### **Tally Indicator LEDs**

Each above set of four memory buttons is assigned a Tally Indicator LED. This LED feature becomes active when the RMC-180 is connected to the tally output of a compatible Datavideo Switcher such as the HS-2000 or HS-2200.

When the HS-2000 or HS-2200 Switcher is sending camera A's video to the program output, the CH A's tally LED will be illuminated on the RMC-180. Additional equipment and cabling are required.

#### RJ-45 ports to connect cameras A, B, C & D

Four RJ-45 ports are provided on the RMC-180 rear to connect PTZ cameras.

The RMC-180 has the ability to receive tally signals from

Datavideo Switchers such as the HS-2000 or HS-2200. Using the video switcher's tally output signals, the RMC-180 can turn on an LED on the keyboard, giving the camera operator an indication of which camera is currently live at the

# **DC In Socket**

Tally Input

Connect the supplied 12V 0.5A PSU to this socket. The connection can be secured by screwing the outer fastening ring of the DC In plug to the socket. The connection is centre positive.

**Power On/Off Switch** Switches the unit On / Off.

# **Grounding Terminal**

When connecting this unit to any other component, make sure that it is properly grounded by connecting this terminal to an appropriate point. When connecting, use the socket and be sure to use wire with a cross-sectional area of at least 1.0 mm<sup>2</sup>.

#### 5. PAN DIRECTION SET

Set the camera pan direction to normal or reversed (LEFT/RIGHT).

#### 6. TILT DIRECTION SET

Set the camera tilt direction to normal or reversed (UP/DOWN).

#### 7. ZOOM DIRECTION

Set the camera zoom direction to normal or reversed (ZOOM IN/OUT).



Turn the joystick left to zoom in or right to zoom out.

#### 8. FOCUS DIRECTION SET

Set the camera focus direction to normal or reversed (LEFT/RIGHT).

- Step 1 Push the Auto/Manual button, and the button LED will be turned on.
- Step 2 Push FOCUS Knob, the Auto/Manual button will start flashing.
- Step 3 Push Auto/Manual button to select the FOCUS control speed.
- Step 4 Push and turn the **FOCUS Knob** to adjust the camera focus.

#### 9. IRIS DIRECTION SET

Set the camera iris direction to normal or reversed (LEFT/RIGHT).

- Step 1 Push the Auto/Manual button, and the button LED will be turned on.
- Step 2 Push the IRIS Knob, the Auto/Manual button will start flashing.
- Step 3 Push the **Auto Manual** button to select IRIS control speed.

• Step 4 - Push and turn the IRIS Knob to adjust the camera iris.

# **Storing Different Camera Positions**

The RMC-180 allows you to store up to four camera positions for each of the four possible cameras, CH A, B, C and D. This means, with four PTZ cameras connected to the RMC-180, up to sixteen camera positions can be stored.

**NB:** The position and settings are stored in the camera and not in the RMC-180.

#### To store a cameras position:


1. Select the camera that you wish to use: CH A / CH B / CH C / CH D

- 2. Adjust the camera lens to the desired position or view using the joystick. Set the focus, Iris and zoom to the desired camera video output.
- 3. Push the STR (store) button and it will be illuminated.




4. The corresponding four memory buttons of the selected camera will be illuminated and to save the current position, auto-focus and PTZ settings, simply press a memory button



5. The pressed memory button will remain illuminated for 2 seconds and the button LED will be turned off after the settings are successfully saved.

# **Firmware Upgrade Procedure**

From time to time, Datavideo may release new firmware to either add new features or to fix reported bugs in the current RMC-180 firmware. Customers can update the firmware themselves if they wish or they can contact their local dealer or reseller for assistance should they prefer this method.

This section describes the firmware update process and it should take *approximately 30 minutes to complete*. Once started, *the update process should not be interrupted in any way* as this could result in a non-responsive unit.


Requirement

- Latest firmware update files (bootloader and application firmware)
- A USB A to USB A cable not longer than 2 meters
- A Windows PC with USB 2.0 ports
- 1. Power off the RMC-180 and connect the USB A cable between the USB firmware upgrade port

2. Press and hold the four buttons indicated with  $\bigotimes$  at the same time






5. The RMC-180 device (**RMC-180\_U38**) will appear as a removable storage device on the PC as shown below.




- 6. Double click on the RMC-180\_U38 removable storage device and delete the "bootcode.bin" file

- 8. Reboot the RMC-180 device until the LCD displays the following




9. Press the MENU key to start the firmware upgrade and do not disconnect the power before the upgrade is complete




10. After the bootloader firmware upgrade is complete, the LCD display will show the following and the user may proceed to upgrading the application firmware.



11. Remove bootcode.bin from the RMC-180 device and copy and paste the application firmware into the RMC-180 device




12. Reboot the RMC-180 device again and the LCD display will now show the following.
